| Registering with a GP | If you're moving to Hull, the University requires you to register with a GP. All international students (non-EU) who are studying in the UK on a course of study of six months or more, qualify for National Health Service (NHS) treatme from the beginning of their stay, on the same basis as anyone else who is ordinarily resident in the UK. This means that you can access free NHS health care provision, and you can register with an NHS doctor, known in the UK as General Practitioner (GP). Most GPs work together in groups, known as GP Surgeries. | |
